· Partial removal and trimming of the underbody panel

To help prevent damage to the product or vehicle, refer to the specified torque specifications when securing hardware during the installation process.







ASSEMBLY

Parts List			
Item	Qty	Description	
1	2	Carriage bolt, 7/16"-14 x 1-1/4", grade 8	
2	4	Hex bolt, M10 x 1.25 – 35	
3	2	Serrated-flange nut, 7/16" - 14	
4	4	Conical-toothed washer, 3/8"	







Step 1

Remove the seven plastic fasteners from the bottom of the bumper cover and the top fastener from inside each wheel well by pushing in the center. Save all fasteners for reinstallation in Step 7.

Note: If the vehicle has mud flaps, remove them first by using an 8mm socket to remove the two bolts and a flathead screwdriver to remove the two push fasteners. Set aside for reinstallation in Step 7.






Step 2

Carefully remove the bumper cover by pulling the sides away from the vehicle and then straight back. Set aside for reinstallation in Step 7.

Note: Disconnect any electrical connectors while removing the cover.





Step 3

Remove four bolts using a 17mm socket and two nuts using a 14mm socket from the bumper beam. Save the nuts for reinstallation in Step 5. Remove the bumper beam and set aside for reinstallation in Step 5.





Step 4

Raise the hitch into position, sliding the tabs into the frame rail. Fishwire 7/16" carriage bolts (#1) into place through the hole in the side plate and out the bottom of the frame rail. Secure with 7/16" serrated flange nut (#3).

Note: Temporarily installing the nuts removed in Step 3 to secure the hitch in place may ease installation of carriage bolt.





Step 5

Place the bumper beam over the hitch and secure with the nuts removed in Step 3. Loosely install the supplied M10 bolts (#2) and conical-toothed washers (#4).




Step 6


Torque all M10 hardware to 45 ft-lbs and 7/16" hardware to 59 ft-lbs.



Step 7

Trim the bumper fascia using the trim diagram to the right for reference. Reinstall the bumper cover removed in Step 2.
